




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From the School Board

From the Principal

2024 marked a significant milestone for Georges River Grammar as we celebrated our school's 40th Anniversary.

It has been both an honour and a privilege this year to reflect on our school's history and the remarkable achievements that have shaped our school into the vibrant, inclusive and supportive community that it is today. In Term 1, we officially introduced and opened the new Haig Ave Reserve, which allowed for the construction of the much-anticipated School Auditorium to commence in the Easter School Holiday Break. Our campus also saw various new additions introduced, including the LED Screen on our Wood Building at the School's entrance, the structural Pencils installation in our Primary Playground, and the immensely popular GRG Food Truck. Our school also continued to introduce new ways to improve our overall environmental footprint, with new solar panels being installed on our Rossiter Building and LED lights being rolled out in all our classrooms. I want to thank our P&F Association for their unwavering support with these exciting, new initiatives.

In Term 2, the School conducted a comprehensive community-wide survey, co-administered with AISNSW, that reached out to all parents, staff and students to collect their views and ideas on all aspects of our school, focusing on how GRG can continue to persist in driving improvement, innovation and change

The results from this survey were overwhelmingly positive across all five domains (School Environment, Teaching & Learning, Student Wellbeing, Leadership and Community). One of the key highlights from the survey is that an astounding 98% of parents expressed pride in having their children attend GRG and would recommend our school to the wider community. This is testament to the sense of community and shared values that define our school, and have done so since 1984. The feedback provided throughout this survey will play a significant role in guiding the School's future direction in the coming years, as we continually strive for ongoing growth and success.

As is always the case at GRG, there was never a dull moment. Regular events such as Open Day, GRG Movie Night, Variety Night, Primary Production, Grandparent's Day, Mother's Day and Father's Day, all proved to be our biggest yet. The list of annual school events grows every year, and in 2024 we introduced K-2 Splash Day, International Day and Wellness Week, to name just a few. These events are integral to the sense of community and spirit that distinguishes us at GRG.

2024 also saw the expansion of our school's Co-Curricular Program and the introduction of weekly competitive sport in Years 7-8. Our Primary Choir participated in GRG's firstever IPSHA Music Festival, performing at Town Hall in front of hundreds of people, and our inaugural Secondary Chess Team won the Sydney Academy of Chess' Inter-School Chess Tournament. 

Contextual Information About the School

Georges River Grammar (GRG) is a diverse, inclusive and supportive co-educational independent school for students from Kindergarten to Year 12, located in Sydney's South-West. Affectionately known as GRG, the School is a dynamic and supportive environment that offers students a well-rounded, holistic and comprehensive educational experience which enables them to thrive, grow and prosper. The School provides students with a vibrant, encouraging and enriching learning environment, governed by its Christian ethos and the School's values of community, sacrifice, service and compassion.

The aims and objectives of GRG are to:

- create a nurturing environment which is defined by care, support, and community;
- develop students into compassionate, resilient, engaged and accomplished lifelong learners, ready to face the challenges of an increasingly complex world;
- help grow outward-looking members of the community who are considerate, respectful and conscientious;
- offer excellence in all facets of a well-rounded education;
- provide students with opportunities to discover and develop their passions; and,
- foster a sense of belonging within every student, parent and member of the school community, where relationships are developed and built with mutual respect, trust and empathy.

Characteristics of the Student Body

The School caters to a multi-culturally diverse and inclusive community, with many of our students coming from a language background other than English. The majority of students live within a geographically accessible suburb to the School, largely in the south western suburbs of Sydney and the Sutherland Shire.

In 2024, there were 922 students enrolled in the School. There is a relatively equal gender balance throughout the School. The School has a small population of about 1% who identify as Aboriginal, Torres Strait Islander or both. The School also enrols overseas students for the senior years.

Theme Two Outcomes & Results

Standardised Testing

The National Assessment Program - Literacy and Numeracy (NAPLAN) tests the literacy and numeracy skills of all students in Years 3, 5, 7, and 9. All parents receive an individual report for their child's test results.

The table below shows the average student results of Georges River Grammar in 2024, when compared to all Australian students. Cells coloured dark blue indicate that GRG students achieved well above average when compared to all Australian students, whilst light blue indicates that GRG students achieved above average in comparison to all Australian students. The cells that remain indicate that the School's results are 'close' to those of all students nationally.



Post-School Destinations

The vast majority of students who graduated at the end of Year 12 in 2024, following completion of their Higher School Certificate, enrolled at university. Of the 62 students to complete their HSC and received an ATAR, 89% were offered a place at university. These students gained university admission into a variety of courses in the areas of Commerce, Computer Science, Construction, Engineering, Education, Nursing, Health Science, Law, and Psychology.

Management of Non-Attendance

Attendance at Georges River Grammar is very high. Extended or repeated non-attendance by students was usually for illness. In the rare situation that a student had prolonged or repeated non-attendance not related to illness, the School has implemented the following strategies to improve unsatisfactory attendance and student engagement in school and learning:

- The School encourages parents/guardians to understand their legal obligations to ensure their child attends school, and does not condone absences for unauthorised reasons, including, but not limited to events such as birthdays, family holidays and/or other leisure activities.
- Regular meetings are conducted between the Director of Student Wellbeing, Stage Coordinators (Primary) and Heads of Year (Secondary), as appropriate, to coordinate responses to student absences.
- If a student is absent for more than three days and this is unexplained, the Classroom Teacher (Primary) or Head of Year (Secondary) will contact the parent to check-in. Any absence in excess of three days with no explanation is referred to the School's Senior Leadership Team.
- Students with persistently low attendance are monitored, and personalised strategies implemented to increase
 their attendance and/or engage them in continuing with their education program. For students requiring more
 intensive support, one-on-one meetings and alternative arrangements are organised in consultation with parents/
 guardians. Where appropriate, the School will work with the parents/carers and the student to develop an Attendance
 Improvement Plan or seek the assistance of external agencies, including the Association of Independent Schools NSW.
- Where frequent absences are explained as being due to illness, the School requests medical certificates for the absences and will consult with parents/guardians regarding the health care needs of the student.
- For continued, unjustified absences, or concerns regarding 'Educational Neglect', the Director of Student Wellbeing makes a mandatory report to the Community Services Child Protection Helpline. Contact will also be made with the Child Wellbeing Unit if there are safety, welfare or wellbeing concerns in relation to student attendance.


